

ELIGIBILITY CHECKLIST

This checklist will help health care practitioners and other community and social service providers identify those eligible for a Coordinated Care Plan using the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (MOHLTC) target population definition (below). Once identified, the person can be engaged to participate in Coordinated Care Planning.
