

Palliative Care Education Program



The Palliative Care Education Program (PCEP) offers education and training to health service providers (HSPs), Community Support Services (CSSs), and volunteers by group session, individualized coaching, and mentoring.

The program includes introductory, advanced, and enhanced palliative care education to frontline care providers and incorporates best practice and research findings into palliative care education curriculum through sharing of information at the local level and updating educational materials regionally. The program goal is to build capacity among frontline care providers who are supporting individuals and families living with a life-limiting, life-threatening illness.

The PCEP Operations Team consists of nurse educators who are responsible for overseeing the annual education plan which includes the coordination and preparation of all palliative care education offered through Home and Community Care Support Services South East, as well as participate in the facilitation of other validated course offerings such as Learning Essential Approaches to Palliative Care (LEAP), overseen by Pallium Canada.

The PCEP Education Plan may include, but is not limited to, courses, refresher days, mentoring programs and videoconferencing options. The program uses a variety of instructional methods including coaching, course presentation, hands-on workshops, case-based discussion, distance learning, and self-directed online modules using experience-based design.
