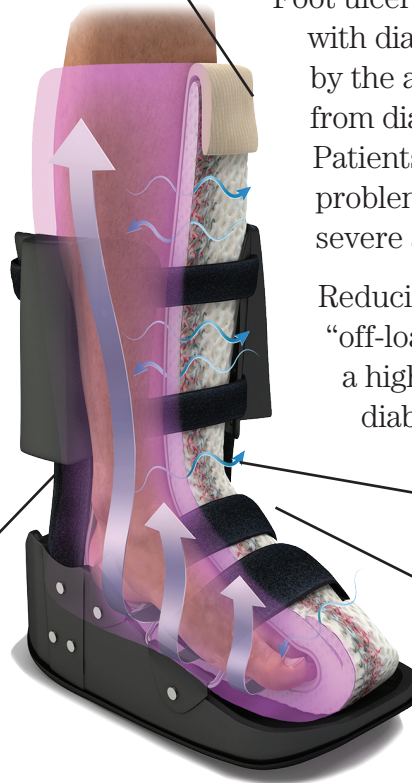

Why use Total Contact Casting?

When people have wounds on the bottoms of their feet, healing can be delayed by the day-to-day pressures caused by standing and walking. Total Contact Casting eliminates those pressures by evenly redistributing your weight across the entire foot area.

As a result, healing time is reduced to a matter of weeks, compared to many months and sometimes years using conventional dressings. Moreover, the risk of complications, including life-threatening infections and amputations, is greatly reduced.

Why healing is so important.

Foot ulcers are the most serious of all diabetes-related complications. Foot ulcers reportedly precede lower leg amputations in up to 85% of cases.

Foot ulcers are very common in patients with diabetes. This is caused, in part, by the absence of pain that results from diabetes-related nerve damage. Patients are often unaware of the problems until the resulting ulcers are severe and require special treatment.

Reducing pressure on the wound by “off-loading” weight has proven to be a highly effective treatment for diabetic foot ulcers.
