- Hospice funding for Carpenter Hospice and St. Joseph's Villa announced by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.
- Grand opening of Joseph Brant Hospital occurred on December 11, 2018.
- Additional mental health and addictions funding from the ministry is anticipated however funding parameters are unknown at this time therefore Requests for Proposals are not being undertaken by this LHIN.
- The operation approval of the Overdose Prevention Site in Hamilton has been extended until January 31, 2019. An application to become a Consumption Treatment Site would need to occur at that time.
- HNHB will receive an additional \$4M for surge beds (seasonal increases) in three hospitals (27 beds for Hamilton Health Sciences, 20 beds for Niagara Health System, and 20 beds for Joseph Brant) to manage surge until March 31, 2019.
- Multiple requests have been submitted to the ministry to fill mission critical non-union roles. Patient-facing roles are not impacted by the provincial hiring directive.
- West Lincoln funding is to remediate current situation and is not a contribution to the rebuild.

Whereas, the Order in Council of two other Board members are set expire on December 31, 2018 and February 26, 2019 respectively, and

Whereas, it is unknown whether or not the Lieutenant Governor in Council will designate a Chair or Vice Chair effective January 1, 2019;

Therefore, be it resolved that in the event that the Lieutenant Governor in Council:

- i. Does not designate a Chair or Vice Chair effective January 1, 2019; and/or
- ii. Does not reappoint Board members whose Order in Council is set to expire on December 31, 2018; and/or
- iii. Does not reappoint the Board member whose Order in Council is set to expire on February 26, 2019;

And given that the Board, in fulfilling its responsibilities to manage and control the affairs of the Hamilton Niagara Haldimand Brant LHIN, consider it to be in the public interest for:

- i. the Board to ensure that a Board member is selected as Vice Chair in advance of and effective January 1, 2019, with the understanding that the Board-selected Vice Chair will have all the authorities set out in By-Law 1 Section 6(02), including the authority to sign all documents requiring the Chair's signature, notwithstanding that the Board may elect to impose conditions on such authorities, as the Board may consider appropriate, as provided in the *Local Health System Integration Act, 2006*, until such time as the Lieutenant Governor in Council designates a Chair or Vice Chair; and
- ii. the Board, in the event that those members whose Orders in Councils are set to expire on December 31, 2018 and February 26, 2019 respectively are not renewed prior to the expiration date, ensure knowledge and oversight continuity by retaining those individuals as volunteer committee members;
