

Centralized Diabetes Intake

Patient Information Sheet

The Centralized Diabetes Intake is a streamlined and integrated referral service for people living with or at risk of developing diabetes.

Centralized Diabetes Intake (CDI) is provided by Ontario Health atHome to link patients living with or at risk of developing diabetes to Diabetes Education Programs (DEP) or the Central East Centre for Complex Diabetes Care (CCDC).

The CDI Care Coordinator will determine the need for DEP or CCDC services. Together, the patient and care coordinator choose the most appropriate location for these diabetes services.

CDI offers access as appropriate to:

- Diabetes Education Programs
- Centre for Complex Diabetes Care
- Central East Regional Cardiovascular Rehabilitation & Secondary Prevention Program
- Ontario Health atHome services
- Community Support Services (i.e. Meals on Wheels)
- Health Care Connect (for those who are not connected with a Primary Care Provider)
- The Central East Self-Management Program

If a patient is seen at a DEP, they will have access to:

- Basic-intermediate level diabetes education services for people living with diabetes or prediabetes
- Group classes or individual counseling
- Education on self-managing their diabetes and preventing/delaying the onset of diabetes-related complications
- Diabetes Education Teams consisting of one nurse and one dietitian

If a patient is referred to the CCDC, they will have access to:

- Support for patients 18 years of age or older living with Type 1 or Type 2 diabetes who have complex needs
- An inter-professional team consisting of nurse practitioners, dietitians, social workers, nurses, and pharmacists
- Regular updates provided to the referring physician/nurse practitioner
- Transition/discharge planning in collaboration with Primary Care Provider and Diabetes Education Program will occur once case management and self-management goals are met


